ECONOMIC RECOVERY PROJECTS MUNICIPAL/SPONSOR RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the **Sheafe Road: South Road to Channingville Road** Identified as **PIN 8760.85**, an Economic Recovery Project (hereinafter "the Project") in the **Town of Poughkeepsie** (hereinafter "the Municipality/Sponsor"), **in Dutchess County**, is eligible for funding under Title 23 US Code, as amended, that calls for the apportionment of the costs of such project to be borne at the ratio of 100% Federal funds and 0% non-federal funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Municipality/Sponsor's Board convened does hereby:

RESOLVED, that the Municipality/Sponsor's Board hereby approves the Project; and it is hereby further

RESOLVED, that the Municipality/Sponsor agrees to advance the Project through the Municipality/Sponsor's resources and agrees that the Municipal/Sponsor's Board hereby authorizes the Municipality/Sponsor to pay in the first instance the full federal and full nonfederal costs of any and all phases(s) or portions thereof.

RESOLVED, that the Municipality/Sponsor's Board makes a 100" commitment of the non-federal share (if any) of the costs of **Construction/Construction Inspection** phase(s) of work for the Project or portions thereof, with the federal share of such costs to be applied directly by the New York State Department of Transportation ("NYSDOT") pursuant to the State/Local Agreement; and it is hereby further

RESOLVED, that the sum of \$1,600,000.00 is hereby appropriated from Account H23 and made available to cover the cost of participation to complete the Project including all phase(s) or portions thereof.

RESOLVED, that upon the completion of the construction of the Project, or a fully usable portion thereof, the Municipality/Sponsor agrees to maintain the Project, or fully usable portion thereof, at their sole cost and expense; and it is hereby further

RESOLVED, that in the event the full federal and non-federal share of the Projects exceeds the amount appropriated above, the Municipality/Sponsor Legislature shall convene as soon as possible to appropriate said excess amount immediately; and it is hereby further

RESOLVED, that the **Town Supervisor** is hereby authorized to execute all necessary Agreements or certifications on behalf of the Municipality/Sponsor, (subject to the Municipal/Sponsor Attorney's approval as to form and content), with NYSDOT in connection with the advancement or approval of the Project identified in the State/Local Agreement; and providing for the administration of the Project and the Municipality/Sponsor's first instance funding of the non-federal share of project costs and permanent funding of the local share of federal-aid and state-aid eligible Project costs and all Project costs within appropriations therefore that are not so eligible; and it is further

RESOLVED, that in addition to the **Town Supervisor**, the following municipal titles: **Town Engineer, Town Highway Superintendent, Town Clerk and Town Comptroller** are also hereby authorized to execute any necessary Agreements or certifications on behalf of the Municipality/Sponsor, with NYSDOT in connection with the advancement or approval of the project identified in the State/Local Agreement; and it is further

RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this Resolution be filed with the New York State Commissioner of the Department of Transportation by attaching it to any necessary Agreement in connection with the Project; and it is further

Supervisor Myers: Just one announcement: The Legislature decided to put most of the non-sense they were going to take out, back into their budgets so that we won't be hit with \$100,000 worth of election expenses or anything like that. Other news is that, we were notified by the State Real Property Taxes Offices, that the State Aid, the maintenance aid we normally get, due to the Governor's recent legislative budget saving actions, is going to be cut by 12.5%, which is about \$7,000.00 to us.

Councilman Tancredi: They made us a promise when we did our re-val to entice us to keep everything at 100%, that they would help us fund it.

Supervisor: Well, everybody is being cut across the board 12.5%. They will still be providing \$60,000.00.

Doreen Tignanelli: I know the Board is considering changing and amending some of the laws that have to do with fees in the Town and while you are looking at that, there was something else that I don't know if at the same time you can do any thing. Back in June I came before the Board and talked about the trees in front of TGI Friday's that had been somewhat damaged and that there were materials being stored in the drip line and the Planning Department really did try on a number of occasions to get them to clean up the site and take better care of the trees, but that really didn't happen because they ended up taking down one of the trees and another tree that was the most severely damaged, they left there. As far as I know, they did replace two or three small trees, 2" to 3", but these trees were like 10" to 12" and the way the Code is written, 146-4, "Position and Collection of Fees", it says, "Any trees that are removed in consistent with the approved plan, shall be replaced, in kind, and a payment of \$500 per each tree improperly removed, shall be paid to the Town of Poughkeepsie Open Space Fund." I don't believe that happened, because it seems there is some wiggle room as to what "Improperly removed" means, because they damaged the tree and removed it in conjunction with the Planning Department. Maybe you should say something like, "If damaged within in the result of the death of the tree. It's really not equal, because they replaced the tree with a 2" or 3" tree when it was about 10" to 12". Is that something you could look into in, because that is like a \$1,000 that could be paid to the Open Space Fund. My other comment, I don't know if the entire Town Board is aware, but Vassar College is going to be doing what they call a "Deer Cull", which is basically that they are killing deer on the Vassar College Farms property. They had to get a permit from the DEC, but my point is that they sent out a press release and an e-mail to the Vassar Community that not only that the Vassar Community is involved in this, but also the City and Town was involved in this as well. Well, I hardly miss a Town Board meeting and I didn't see Vassar come here and make any presentation to the Town. Again, whether you agree with this "kill" or not, I think, if they really want maximum participation, they should have come here and made a presentation to the Town Board and the people at home could also see it. They say, the "Campus and the community are very supportive of our decision". I don't know how they can say that. Nobody asked me and I don't know how many other people in the Town they did ask.

According to further discussion, I guess immediate neighbors and the Town Councilman for the Vassar College Area were invited to a meeting at the College and were notified, however, Doreen felt the whole Town Council Meeting should have been aware.

Victor Gennodi: Last week I heard Neil Wilson talking about, permits, if you are putting in a new window, \$5 per window. It seems absurd, when you are talking about the government trying to make you save fuel oil and economics and everything and at the same time, someone has their hand out. You shouldn't have to get a permit to put new windows in your house and save the heat and all.

Supervisor Myers: I think you will see it different when it comes back.

Victor Gennodi: Oh, ok, because I was like, we were just overburdened that the taxpayers and residents on permits. People want to take care of their house but don't want to constantly be going to the Building Department to get a permit. People should be allowed to do things to their house without getting beat up. Take the handcuffs off the residents.

Councilman Seminara: You're absolutely right, as far as I'm concerned, the resident is the king of castle and the government should mind its own business and leave them alone on minor renovations and you should be allowed to do them. We did a similar thing with the Plumbing Codes at a recent meeting.

Town Clerk Miller: Are the people who are doing the CULLING of deer on Vassar College grounds, licensed deer hunters?

Supervisor Myers: The people who are doing it are special "White Buffalo" and they are sharp shooters and they will be coming in and the meat will go to food banks.
